TERMS AND CONDITIONS
 This accreditation badge is the property of the 2022 Ontario Paralympic Games Host Society and must be visible while attending the Games. The Host Society reserves the right to suspend, revoke or cancel any accreditation badge at any time. Accreditation badges are non-transferable.

Participants are required to wear their accreditation passes at all times throughout the duration of the Games in order to access spaces including accommodations, cafeterias and competition venues.

Procedure - Lost Accreditation Pass

- Participants should inform their PSO Representative or Team Delegation of the lost accreditation
- PSO Representatives or Team Delegation Representatives is to contact Games HQ via phone or email to notify of a lost Accreditation Pass.
- Information to be included:
 - Participant Name
 - Sport
- Games staff will verify credentials of Participant and advise PSO Representatives or Team Delegation Representatives on next steps.
- Games staff will re-print Accreditation Pass of verified Participant and coordinate with PSO Representatives or Team Delegation Representatives for pick up at Games HQ.

- Check-in Process – **Thursday, July 21, 3pm** - PSO Reps will be the representatives for the sport and will be designated as the check-in lead. Reps will check-in on behalf of their sport and receive pre-programmed room keys at the front desk. Reps will be responsible for distributing room keys to their participants. Room keys are based upon final rooming list. Officials will check-in on their own behalf.
- Check-out Process – Keys must be returned to the front desk prior to final departure from the hotel.

3. TRASPORATION

Bus transportation is provided to and from competition venues, Opening Ceremony, and meal locations. No transportation is provided after a participant’s final event as it is the expectation that participant’s will depart from their competition venue (unless previously specified for those external travel pre-approvals).

Schedule – Detailed Transportation schedules will be posted at each Hotel at the Games Information Desk.

Load Zones – Hotel and Venue maps indicating Load Zones will be available at the Games Information Desk at each hotel. There will be a Volunteer at each Hotel and Venue to assist and direct participants.

4. FOOD SERVICES

Breakfast each day of your stay will be a buffet available at your accommodation and will be a selection of hot and cold items. Buffet start and end times are available at your hotel as they are set based on individual sport competition schedules. As a general guideline, breakfast is available between 6am and 10am.

- a. We encourage participants to consult their competition schedules and confirm with team officials on when to eat breakfast to ensure that they are adequately prepared for their transportation from accommodations to competition venue.

- **Lunch** will be served at your competition venue (as a boxed lunch). Directional signage will indicate where to pick up and where the seating area is located at the facility. Any participants who indicated Gluten, Vegan or Lactose intolerant will have a separate labeled meal available. Staff will be onsite with participant lists and will help to facilitate meal distribution. Lunch is based on individual competition schedules and, as a general rule, available between 11am and 2pm.
 - Due to food safety, lunches must be picked up and eaten during the designated lunch period to avoid spoiling and disposal of the meals.
- **Dinner** for all participants will take place each evening at the UTM cafeteria. Generally, dinner is available between 4pm and 8:30pm, however each sport has been assigned a mealtime based on sport schedules. Any participants who indicated Gluten, Vegan, Lactose intolerant or other dietary restrictions will have a separate labeled meal available. Staff will be onsite with participant lists and will help to facilitate meal distribution.

 - Snacks are not provided; please bring snacks to supplement between meals.

 - Our facilities are not nut free, nor can we confirm that products brought into our facilities are prepared in nut free environments.
 - Food services will have a PMR (person most responsible) at each location to answer any questions, distribute special meals and provide general support.

6. MEDICAL

Rowan's Law

2022 Ontario Summer Games hosted by the City of Mississauga Mandate:

- a. The City of Mississauga is committed to ensuring the safety of all individuals who participate in the 2022 Ontario Summer Games. Ontario Regulation 161/19 of Rowan's Law (Concussion Safety), requires all sport organizations as defined in the Regulation, which includes the City of Mississauga, to have a Concussion Code of Conduct.
- b. The Act requires athletes, parents or guardians, coaches, team trainers, and officials to confirm that they have reviewed the Concussion Code of Conduct. You were required to review and confirm receipt that you reviewed the Code of Conduct as well as the Removal from Play and Return to Sport protocols prior to completing your registration.

COVID-19

As of June 11, 2022, The City of Mississauga – host of the 2022 Ontario Summer Games – is in alignment with guidance from the Government of Ontario and no longer requires proof of vaccination or masking requirements to access any City of Mississauga facility or public transit. At this time, third party facilities affiliated with the Games do not require proof of vaccination or masking. Should any third party facilities update their requirements, this information will be shared as soon as available.

Athletes, coaches, managers, and officials attending the 2022 Ontario Summer Games may be subject to vaccination and/or masking requirements as required by their individual Provincial Sport Organization (PSO).

The City of Mississauga will continue to monitor and makes changes as necessary based on updates to regulations and directives provided by the Government of Ontario and/or the Peel Region Public Health Unit.

WELLNESS PLAN

- If, prior to the Games, you are unsure if you should isolate or attend, please use the self-assessment tool provided by the province to determine if you need to self-isolate: <https://covid-19.ontario.ca/self-assessment/>
- If, for any reason, you feel unwell or sick outside of a sports related injury, we have three easy steps to follow:
 - *Inform:* If you feel sick, become sick, or tested positive on a rapid antigen test (RAT) please notify any member of the medical team immediately. If you are not at the venue, you can contact a member of the medical team by calling: 647-203-6659.
 - *Isolate:* Contact a coach or team representative and tell them that you feel unwell. Maintain physical distancing and minimize exposure to others. If you do need to come into contact with others, make sure to wear a mask.
 - *Assess:* A member from the medical team will do an assessment, including a RAT. If you are exhibiting COVID symptoms, or test positive on a RAT, you will need to self-isolate immediately, and contact your doctor or health care provider if symptoms become worse.

7. GAMES MEDICAL SERVICES

- The Medical Team is committed to providing the best care experience for an athlete and participant should they become ill or injured.
- The Medical team will have a full treatment area at each venue with a team of certified practitioners available. Each venue medical team may include: Athletic Therapists, Physio Therapists, Physicians, Paramedic graduates and students supporting these roles. Equipment required to facilitate the needed care will also be available.
- We will also be providing Psychological First Aid and Peer-Support as part of our medical response plan for participants. Access these services as you would for any physical injury by calling: 647-203-0646 (Games Mental Health line).

In addition to the full complement of medical care we will have Polyclinic available for all participants.

Should a participant become injured during competition, Venue Medical Staff will determine whether said participant needs to be transferred to the Polyclinic. If this need is identified, Medical Staff will provide transportation to transfer the participant from their competition venue to the Polyclinic.

If a participant is at their accommodation during the operating hours of the Polyclinic and feels that they require Medical assistance, they should call 647-203-6659 and Medical Staff will determine if they need to be transported.
